Workshop Description

During the 20th century, psychologists recognized that a person's intelligences – verbal-propositional, perceptual-organizational, and the like, were important predictors of success. In the late 20th century, however, the idea that there might also exist “hot” intelligences – dealing with personally pleasant or painful information, including emotional, social, and practical information, arose. The first part of this CE presentation describes emotional intelligence and the research surrounding it. The second part of the presentation (continuing after a break), provides a brief new look at personality psychology and its relevance to assessment, and then returns to an understanding of emotional intelligence and related hot intelligences in the broader context of personality and personality assessment.

Objectives

Participation in this program will enable you to:

- Define emotional intelligence and identify such qualities in clients.
- Distinguish emotional intelligence from other related and unrelated qualities.
- Understand emotional intelligence in the context of overall personality functioning.

Dr. Mayer is Professor of Psychology at the University of New Hampshire. He has served on the editorial boards of the *Journal of Personality*, and the *Review of General Psychology* among others, and has been an Individual National Institute of Mental Health Postdoctoral Scholar

at Stanford University. Dr. Mayer received his Ph.D. and M.A. in psychology at Case Western Reserve University, and his B.A. from the University of Michigan. Dr. Mayer has published extensively in emotional intelligence, integrative models of personality, and the effects of personality on an individual's life.
